The name is the game - Austria's largest bike region delivers exactly what it promises. With over 120 kilometers of lines and trails, up to 9 lifts across 7 mountains, 3 large practice areas for kids and beginners, alpine gravel routes for every preference, and an almost limitless mountain bike trail network for all fitness levels, it's a true playground for riders of all styles.

Austria's largest bike region connects the extensive mountain biking area of Saalbach Hinterglemm with the EPIC Bikepark Leogang and the bike offerings in Fieberbrunn. The result: an unbelievable variety of trails with 120 kilometers of lines and trails for all skill and fitness levels, along with a cross-regional mountain bike and gravel network like no other.

From Rookie to Pro

Work your way up! Beginners will find it easy to get started in Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn, as every village offers practice areas for kids and newcomers. The Learn to Ride Park at the base of the Kohlmais lift in Saalbach features four mini lines, a magic carpet lift, an uphill trail for easy ascent, and a loop with small obstacles—ideal terrain for beginners.

At the EPIC Bikepark Leogang, a 30,000 m² practice area called the Riders Playground awaits. Beginner trails with gentle gradients, a World Champs pump track with jump and dirt lines, and the GoPro Bagjump provide perfect opportunities to refine technique.

In the valley station area of Fieberbrunn, beginners and families will find ideal conditions to gain their first experience on two wheels. With the Obingleitn bike tow lift and the Hänsn Line, there is a perfectly tailored setup to help riders develop balance and control in a playful way. Starting summer 2026, a new skill area with diverse bike-handling features will further expand the offering.

Once the technique and body position are solid, riders can move on to beginner-friendly lines featuring playful elements that also challenge more advanced bikers. Step by step, you progress to more demanding trails—until you're ready to tackle the World Championship downhill track "Speedster" or the root- and rock-filled X-Line. However, you should only attempt these once you can ride all other lines confidently and without having to push your bike.

Limitless mountainbiking

The only limit to your tour is your own fitness level, as the cross-regional mountain bike network is literally endless. Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn offers numerous customizable tour suggestions that can be combined in many ways. Whether you prefer a relaxed alpine hut loop, a scenic panorama ride with lift support, or a demanding MTB marathon, the choice is yours. Along the way, countless mountain huts invite you to recharge and enjoy a well-deserved break.

Gravelbiking in the alps

For many, gravel biking is more than just another form of cycling—it’s about exploration. Whether on long tours, fast loops, or simply discovering new terrain, Austria’s largest bike region has embraced the potential of gravel bikes. Their agile frames and grippy tires open up new off-road possibilities, even for road cyclists. Around Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn, there are plenty of marked routes—or you can create your own.

Unlimited range

Excitement on the bike is guaranteed—but with the rise of e-MTBs, “range” takes on a whole new meaning. Charging stations in the mountains are ready, rental shops have expanded their fleets, and all trails are fully accessible to e-bikers. Dedicated e-bike routes serve as recommended tours particularly suited for e-MTB riders. The motto: stop, recharge, and keep riding—while you take a relaxing break at a mountain hut.

Austria’s largest bike region offers a complete, worry-free package for riders. Numerous bike shops, top rental services, cool bike schools, and experienced guides ensure maximum riding enjoyment. news 2026

There's no off-season without any effort! In 2026, expect new lines and trails, improved infrastructure, and exciting updates in Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn:

Experience legendary sport venues on the new Tour de Champions

The region is internationally known not only for skiing and biking but also for hosting major sport events. This tour connects nine iconic competition venues: From Zwölferkogel, host of the 2025 Alpine Ski World Championships, to the biathlon stadium in Hochfilzen (host of the 2028 World Championships), and the World Cup trails in the Epic Bikepark Leogang—you'll explore locations where champions were crowned and history was made.

New "Bearly Legal" Line

A playful red trail on the Schattberg, stretching 4.9 km with 582 meters of descent. Expect natural obstacles, new features, flowing sections, and surprises. Opens June 4, 2026.

New "ScheeLeitn" Line

Part of the Schönleiten expansion, the first section opens in June 2026 as an e-bike and enduro trail. This 1.7 km red line with 182 meters of descent features airtime elements and offers a glimpse into the future of the region.

New "Wildenkaramba" Line

Also opening in June 2026, this 1.34 km natural red trail runs from the Wildenkarkogel summit plateau and connects to the Thurner Line. Initially available for enduro and e-bikers.

25-Year Anniversary – EPIC Bikepark Leogang

Austria's first bike park celebrates 25 years. New trails include: T-LINE by GoPro (flow trail), GATEWAY (beginner-friendly), BACK TO THE ROOTS (natural singletrail), HANGOVER (challenging black line)

Ladies Shred

A dedicated program for women to improve skills, build confidence, and ride together in a supportive community.

Iglmoos Trail Extension

Extended to 1.8 km in Fieberbrunn, offering more fun for advanced riders with solid technique.

Mountainticket App

Buy tickets in advance, skip queues, and access lifts directly via smartphone—often at lower prices.

Sustainability

Climate-friendly travel by public transport

Since May 2025, all guests registering at their accommodation in the province of Salzburg receive the so-called Guest Mobility Ticket. This allows the use of all public transport within the state of Salzburg for the duration of the stay – regardless of the Joker Card or the Saalfelden Leogang Card.

In Fieberbrunn and the entire Pillersee Valley, holidaymakers can travel free of charge and in an environmentally friendly way with the Pillersee Valley Guest Card, which they receive directly from their accommodation provider. The card is valid as a ticket for regional buses in the valley as well as for local ÖBB trains (S-Bahn and REX) and InterRegio trains (IR) on the route between Kirchbichl, Wörgl and Hochfilzen. IC, EC and Railjet trains are excluded, as they are classified as long-distance transport.

Tip: Nighttrains connections such as Snälltåget from Sweden and Denmark as well as ÖBB long-distance train services enable travel from across Europe. With the new WESTbahn timetable, there are now additional direct connections from the eastern part of Austria like Vienna, St. Pölten, Linz and Salzburg to Maishofen/Saalbach and Saalfelden. In most trains, bike transport is easy and affordable with advance reservations. Alternatively, you can rent a bike on site from one of our local rental partners.

Last-Mile – no problem!

The so-called “last mile” can be covered by bus, taxi or a free train station shuttle, depending on your destination. Some hotels also offer electric cars for rent, ensuring flexibility even when arriving by public transport.

In line with e-mobility, Saalfelden Leogang even offers a culinary e-bike tour, where you cycle from one local producer to another, visit farm shops and taste homemade products.

For maximum convenience, train travelers arriving in Fieberbrunn and Hochfilzen can book a free station shuttle directly to their accommodation in the Pillersee Valley (up to 72 hours before arrival via autofrei.tirol). Those who want additional flexibility can rent an electric car from the tourism office for a small fee (reservation via the municipality of Fieberbrunn, Regio-Tech or the tourism association).

Keep the mountains clean!

“What you bring up the mountain, you bring back down.” Austria’s largest bike region places great importance on respectful interaction with nature. The motto here is “Keep the mountains clean.” One measure to reduce waste is the “Roll-off instead of Tear-off” initiative, which bans tear-off goggle films in the Leogang Bikepark and promotes roll-off systems with fixed film rolls instead. Sustainability is also a priority in trail construction. Many trails in Austria’s largest bike region are built exclusively using natural materials and wooden structures known as “North Shore elements,” with much of the work done by hand.

Lines & Trails - Highlights

From the legendary Hacklberg Trail in Saalbach Hinterglemm to the Speedster – the official downhill World Championship course in the Epic Bikepark Leogang – there is something for everyone! Over 120 km of lines and trails across 7 mountains, perfectly connected by up to 9 cable cars: welcome to Austria's largest bike region!

Saalbach Hinterglemm

Panorama-Line

Another flow line? Yes, please! This 3 km “downhill pump track” runs from the Panorama Alm to the mid-station of the Kohlmais lift, offering high berms, tables, step-ups and step-downs with plenty of airtime.

12er Sky-Line

A 6.5 km trail starting at one of the most beautiful viewpoints in the region, offering spectacular views of the Kitzbühel Alps and the entire Glemmtal valley. Perfect for a relaxed yet sporty ride with flowing berms and small jumps.

X-Line

The ultimate challenge. This 6 km steep track features roots and rock gardens throughout – ideal for experienced downhill riders seeking rough terrain.

Bearly Legal-Line

A playful red line stretching 4.9 km from the Schattberg mid-station to the valley, featuring natural obstacles, new features and surprises along the way.

Hacklberg-Trail

Legendary! With its natural character and stunning panorama, it's a must-ride. Combined with the Buchegg Trail, it offers over 1,000 vertical meters of continuous descent.

Bergstadl-Trail

Technical riders will love this one: tight switchbacks, roots and rocky terrain make it a demanding single trail.

Thurner-Line

A varied trail through dense forest with natural obstacles, waves and jumps – suitable for both beginners and advanced riders.

ScheeLeitn-Line

Partially open from summer 2026, this red, airtime-focused trail gives a glimpse into the future of the bike region.

Note: The Reiterkogel cable car will be modernized in summer 2026; BlueLine and ProLine will be closed during this time.

A pro jumpline packed with airtime – a must for your bucket list.

Speedster

A former UCI World Championship and World Cup track – steep, technical and fast. A real challenge!

Steinberg Line

Perfect for beginners and flow lovers, with gentle gradients and beautiful views.

Flying Gangster

A classic trail with wallrides, berms, jumps and drops.

Bongo Bongo

A technical forest trail with tight turns, roots, rocks and North Shore elements.

Vali's Hölle

A challenging downhill track named after local downhill champion Valentina Höll.

Antonius Trail

A narrow, natural and technically demanding single trail with stunning scenery.

Knappen Trail

A playful natural trail with North Shore elements and connections to other trails.

AlteSchmiede Trail

Flowy turns, North Shores and scenic views across five sections.

Fieberbrunn

New from summer 2026:

The Iglmoos Trail will be extended, and the skill area at the Streuböden valley station will be expanded with training features.

Schweinestberg Line

A 4 km family-friendly trail with flowing curves and small jumps.

Iglmoos Trail

A moderately difficult trail offering more technical challenges.

Streuböden Line

A blue flow trail with various features connecting multiple routes.

Ride Easy: First attempts in the Home of Lässig

For anyone who wants to gain their first experience on a bike, Austria's largest bike region offers ideal conditions. Whether children, beginners or returning riders – in Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn, special practice parks and easy trails await to help you build confidence on the bike step by step. The focus is on playful learning, safety and plenty of riding fun – perfect for getting started in the world of mountain biking!

Learn to Ride Park in Saalbach Hinterglemm

The highlight for all big and small bike newbies: the Learn to Ride Park next to the Kohlmais lift in Saalbach. Here, five well-known Saalbach trails await you in a mini version. After your first riding attempts on the practice loop, you can gradually work your way up on the Learn to Ride Park trails Little Monti, Little Hackberg, Little Panorama, Little Pro-Line and the Drop Area toward the first “real” trails, which start at the Kohlmais mid- and top stations: the Monti Trail and the Panorama Trail. The Learn to Ride Park, including the conveyor belt lift, can be used free of charge.

12er Learn to Ride Area in Saalbach Hinterglemm

Another highlight for beginners of all ages: the 12er Learn to Ride Area at the mid-station of the 12er KOGEL lift in Hinterglemm. Here, a relaxed mountain bike playground awaits, helping you train your skills and prepare for bigger challenges. It's the ideal place to improve your riding ability and confidence on the mountain bike. On four different tracks with various elements, turns and surfaces, you gradually progress step by step and prepare yourself for your first “real trail” – the 12er Sky-Line, which starts at the 12er KOGEL top station. The park is equally suitable for both young and adult mountain bikers.

Riders Playground at the EPIC Bikepark Leogang

Practice makes perfect! Take your first steps in the Riders Playground training area, Europe's largest beginner bike park (over 30,000 m²), located directly at the valley station of the Asitz lift in the EPIC Bikepark Leogang. The tracks around the conveyor belts are perfect for your first downhill bike experiences. Once you've mastered this area, the Riederfeld lift takes you to your first freeride trail – the Greenhorn Trail. In total, you can try out 7 trails before progressing to the blue lines in the park with the help of the trail progression system.

Bike action for beginners in Fieberbrunn

At the Streuböden valley station in Fieberbrunn, the Hänsn Line awaits – an easy trail for your first flow experiences – while the Obingleitn bike drag lift makes the uphill ride easier.

If you're ready for more, take the new panoramic gondolas up to the Streuböden mid-station and try the Schweinestberg Line, which, with its gentle curves and moderate gradients, is a real highlight for beginners and families.

New from summer 2026: a SKILL AREA at the Streuböden valley station, featuring various bike skill elements such as rollers, berms and seesaws, allowing you to specifically improve your riding technique and bike handling

Mountain bike tours of all difficulty levels

Fun rides and easy valley cycle paths can be found in this cross-regional bike area just as much as demanding marathon routes and full-day tours across multiple peaks. The mountain bike trail network, with hundreds of signposted routes, is virtually endless. Combined with up to 9 modern cable cars including bike transport, Austria's largest bike region offers the perfect base camp for mountain bikers of all endurance levels.

Tour tips:

Saalbach Hinterglemm - easy

SH 05 – Talschluss-Loop

The Talschluss Loop is the perfect bike excursion for mountain bike beginners or for a relaxed ride with a culinary stop at an alpine hut. Starting in Hinterglemm, you reach the end of the valley via the Glemmtal cycle path heading upstream.

From there, you gradually gain some elevation – a total of 480 meters – until you reach the highest point at the Ossmannalm. If you're traveling with children, you can take a short walk to explore the educational Wildlife Trail.

Afterwards, a narrow hiking path leads back downhill to the starting point. The section from Lindlingalm to Saalalm is also suitable for bike trailers for children.

Distance: 18.4 km

Duration: approx. 1:45 h

Ascent / descent: 480 m

Saalfelden Leogang – intermediate

LE 06 – Panorama Tour

The views on this tour are truly spectacular. To the north, the rugged limestone peaks of the Leogang Steinberge and the Steinernes Meer; to the east, the striking Hochkönig massif; to the south, the majestic peaks of the Hohe Tauern; and to the west, the unique Wilder Kaiser mountain range.

First, you ride comfortably uphill using the Asitz lift or the Steinberg lift to the top station (lift ticket required). After the Asitz Trail (or alternatively via the forest road) to the Schönleitenhütte, the route continues with alternating climbs and descents, passing the Jahnhütte and Örgenbauernalm to the Biberg mountain inn.

Here, you can enjoy the stunning panorama from one of the region's most beautiful viewpoints and treat yourself to local culinary delights before starting the descent towards Leogang. The final kilometers back to the starting point can then be completed at a relaxed pace.

Distance: 31.8 km

Duration: approx. 3:30 h

Ascent: 640 m

Descent: 1,570 m

Fieberbrunn - difficult

SH 72 – Hennerleiter Loop

The “Hennerleiter” – Gerstbodenalm loop tour is a challenge for strong legs, but rewards you with shaded forest sections, a small waterfall, magnificent views and delicious local specialties.

Starting from the Gasthof Eiserne Hand in Fieberbrunn, the route follows the stream into the Hörndlinger Graben valley. A popular first stop is at the “Screaming Springs,” a small waterfall. Via the so-called “Hennerleiter,” the trail turns left shortly before the Pulvermacher alpine hut and climbs in steep switchbacks to the Gerstbodenalm, continuing towards the valley station of the Wetterkreuz chairlift in Saalbach.

After another short climb, you’re rewarded with an enjoyable descent – followed by a tough choice: stop at the Spielberghaus or continue a few minutes further to the Burgeralm? Both options are well worth it! From the Burgeralm, the route returns to the starting point via a forest road.

Distance: 21 km

Duration: approx. 4 h

Ascent / descent: 870 m

Their titles – your tour: Discover legendary sports venues on the Tour de Champions

The new Tour de Champions connects nine legendary competition venues into one unique experience. From the Zwölferkogel, where the Alpine Ski World Championships took place in 2025, to the Biathlon World Championship stadium in Hochfilzen (host of the 2028 championships), and the World Cup trails in the Epic Bikepark Leogang – you explore places where world champions have already been crowned and where future titles will be decided.

How ambitious your route becomes is entirely up to you. One thing is certain: you’ll be riding where sporting history has been written – and is continuing to come alive.

Gravel biking in the alps

Austria's largest bike region has so far been primarily known among downhill and mountain bike enthusiasts. However, thanks to the predominantly hilly terrain with its extensive network of forest roads around the Glemmtal valley, Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn is also emerging as an attractive destination for gravel bikers.

This still relatively new cycling discipline is more than just another way of riding a bike. For gravel enthusiasts, it's all about being out on the road – whether on long tours, fast laps on gravel, or simply exploring the surroundings. Thanks to the agile frame design and tires with more tread, new routes away from paved roads are now opening up even for dedicated road cyclists.

Anyone exploring Austria's largest bike region on a gravel bike can follow numerous signposted tours – or create their own individual routes.

Tour tip: 2-day gravel biking tour through Austria's largest bike-region

This tour can be started from Saalbach Hinterglemm, Saalfelden, Leogang or Fieberbrunn and, with excellent fitness, can be completed in one day – or more comfortably over two days. A total of 88.5 km and 2,585 meters of elevation gain connect a diverse gravel route through Austria's largest bike region.

E-MTB – enjoy an easy ride & culinary delights

By cable car and e-bike to the most beautiful peaks of Saalbach Hinterglemm

The 400 km bike trail network is easily accessible for everyone thanks to the summer cable cars. Of course, e-bikers can also use the gondolas without restrictions and take their bikes along. No matter how you explore Austria's largest bike region, one of the more than 40 mountain huts is the perfect meeting point – especially their sunny terraces.

Tour tip: BIG (E)PIC

An endurance-focused e-bike loop with sensational panoramic views, numerous refreshment stops, five charging stations along the route, and fun trails.

If the roughly 55 km tour becomes too long, there are several options along the way to return to the valley earlier.

E-bike gourmet tour in Saalfelden Leogang

Lovingly designed farm shops and a self-service station for organic vegetables and honey – these are just some of the stops along the e-bike gourmet tour.

The route is suitable for both e-bike professionals and beginners – the most important thing is to take your time and enjoy the experience. Plenty of bike services are available along the way. A refreshing change from the many culinary stops is a dip in Lake Ritzensee.

Bike & Hike tour with picnic at a mountain lake in Fieberbrunn

Getting up early is worth it – especially for the tour to the Griesenbodenalm in Fieberbrunn. Equipped with a basket full of homemade products collected at the alpine hut, you cycle to a nearby mountain lake, which sparkles in the early morning light. Here, you can enjoy not only the authentic taste of homemade delicacies but also the peaceful silence.

As the tour continues, it's best to leave your bike at the Wildalmen. The Wildalm cheese shop offers tastings and sales, and even features the smallest cinema in the mountains, showing nostalgic tourism films and photographs from Fieberbrunn.

Thanks to electric support, your legs are still fresh enough for a hike to the Wildseelodersee. After about 45 minutes on foot, you reach the legendary mountain lake nestled between the peaks of Wildseeloder (2,118 m) and Henne (2,077 m).

THE CHALLENGE – Bike your limit

„THE CHALLENGE - Bike your limit“ is the ultimate test in Austria’s largest bike region – one that only the best can complete. Who can manage to ride the entire area around Saalbach Hinterglemm Leogang Fieberbrunn in a single day? Thanks to modern cable cars, it is possible!

THE CHALLENGE now even takes you via the 12er Sky-Line up to the summit of the Zwölferkogel, the mountain that hosted the Alpine Ski World Championships. While demanding bike park lines await in Leogang, the Schweinestberg Line and the new Streuböden Line in Fieberbrunn provide plenty of trail fun and scenic views.

The challenge can be completed from June 4 to September 27, 2026.

Info: Due to technical issues in the Skiline app, registration and tracking for “The Challenge” are currently not working. In the meantime, the challenge can still be completed without the app – the lifts used are recorded directly via your lift pass at the ticket office.

„THE CHALLENGE – Bike your limit“ can be started at any destination or at any cable car.

Location: H1 Kohlmaisbahn cable car , A1 Schattberg X-press cable car, B1 12er KOGEL Bahn cable car , L1 Asitzbahn cable car, L3 Steinbergbahn cable car and F1 Streubödenbahn cable car.

Info: The D1 Reiterkogel cable car in Saalbach Hinterglemm will be modernized in summer 2026. Due to construction work, the BlueLine and ProLine will not be accessible during this time. However, THE CHALLENGE can still be fully completed even without the descent at Reiterkogel.

Your challenge – your reward

The tour ends back at your original starting point. If you successfully complete THE CHALLENGE, you’ve definitely earned a reward. Simply present your lift ticket at one of the cable car ticket offices (or at the info center) in Leogang to receive your reward.

To get a chance to win additional prizes, you can also register for the challenge raffle. You will receive the link together with your instant reward.

Among all successful “challengers” listed in the Hall of Fame, three main prizes will be raffled off at the end of the season:

Looking ahead: Saalfelden Leogang will host the UCI Mountain Bike World Championships from August 30 to September 3, 2028.

RUSH 300 SAALFELDEN LEOGANG - July 5, 2026

In July, the RUSH 300 takes riders over 300 km and 2,500 meters of elevation through the impressive alpine landscape of SalzburgerLand.

Starting and finishing in Saalfelden Leogang, the road cycling event features long climbs, fast descents and varied terrain. Four refreshment stations, support vehicles and mechanic services ensure optimal support.

Riders compete in guided groups – a true challenge for body and mind and a gateway into the exclusive 300 Club.
